Due to the latest updates from The College Board- USA that months of May and June 2021 are the last two months available to register and attend SAT Subjects, therefore, the ministry of education has officially announced the replacement for the SAT Subjects. The replacement is ACT Subjects along with ACT 1. Students who have taken and passed successfully SAT Subjects are eligible to keep their SAT Subjects scores. These SAT Subjects scores are fully recognized, certified and approved by the ministry of education for either internationally or locally (Jordanian Board of Equivalency) recognition and purposes. American Program students have the chance to mix between the two exam board tests (SAT Subjects and ACT Subjects) in order to complete successfully the Jordanian high school diploma certificate requirements by the end of grade 12.

American Program Senior graduate students "Grade 12" have the chance to register and attend ACT subjects after June 2021 just in case if they haven't successfully passed SAT Subject tests or they would like to improve their test scores. In addition, college Board is still offering SAT1 and AP tests.

Oxford Schools, teachers and staff members would like to confirm that The American Program is proudly honored and fully recognized worldwide and locally. The decision taken was "A replacement of one test board with another". Our American school curricula do cover new replacement syllabuses. Our teachers are fully aware and well-prepared for the new upcoming replacement "ACT Subjects".
